

SHOW AND ENTRY INFORMATION

NEW

- ◆ The Halter Judges will be Dave Barboza, (suri), Wade Gease, (huacaya males) and Ken Hibbits, (huacaya females). Dave will judge the Suri Group Classes, Wade and Ken will judge the Huacaya Group Classes.
- ◆ An exhibitors' meeting will be held at 8:00 a.m. Saturday, May 1, in the show ring for the purpose of updating you on information for the show.
ATTENDANCE IS MANDATORY.
- ◆ We will have three (3) rings going simultaneously. One for Huacaya males, one for Huacaya females and one for Suris.
- ◆ The handler's attire for the Halter Classes should be conservative, neat and appropriate for the class. No open toe shoes.
- ◆ All alpacas entered must be registered with the Alpaca Registry, Inc. and microchipped. *(Due to Government Regulations, there will be NO re-micro chipping on the fairgrounds of out of state alpacas coming to the show.)*
- ◆ All alpacas must be entered in the name of the owner as listed on the ARI Registration Certificate. Animals that are being purchased or certificates that have not been transferred must have a "Owner of Record for Show Entry Form" signed by the owner that is listed on the ARI Registration Certificate. The form can be downloaded from the show division Web site: www.alpacashows.com. An animal may **NOT** be entered in any class more than once. AOBA show rules do not permit animals with pending papers to show.
- ◆ Age of alpaca is determined from the date of the first scheduled day of judging – May 1, 2010.
- ◆ Because exhibitors may not know who the other exhibitors are until arrival, entry deadline for the Produce of Dam and Get of Sire Classes is 6 p.m. on Saturday, May 1. If the exhibitor is not the owner of the Dam or Sire, written permission from the owner must be submitted. ARI Registration Certificate for Dam or Sire must be submitted if not entered in the show. A copy of the ARI Registration Certificate for each of the three progeny in Get of Sire and two progeny in Produce of Dam must also be provided to the Show Superintendent, if entering at the show. All offspring must be eligible and entered in their respective Halter Classes. Be aware that any additions will not be listed in the show book.
- ◆ The Exhibitor Rule applies. The owner can enter only three (3) alpacas per breed type (Huacaya or Suri) per gender, per age division, per color designation.
- ◆ **AS AN EXHIBITOR, IT IS YOUR RESPONSIBILITY TO BE ON TIME FOR CLASSES.** Once the class has entered the arena and the judge and gatesman have agreed that this is the class, late exhibitors may not enter a class.
- ◆ The entry fees are:
 - \$45 per class per animal
 - \$30 for Get of Sire (3 animals)
 - \$30 for Produce of Dam (2 animals)
 - \$25 for Breeders Best (3 animals)
 - \$25 for Bred & Owned Yearling
 - \$15 for Youth ProgramPrizes will include rosette ribbon for 1st through 6th place in each class, with banners for Color and Reserve Champions. Free CD for all first place, color and reserve champions.
- ◆ All entries received after Tuesday, April 6, 2010 will be charged a late fee of \$25 for each animal entered in addition to the normal entry fee.
- ◆ There is a required \$75 AOBA fee for all farms that are not **A MEMBER OF THE AOBA SHOW DIVISION**. It is \$75 per farm, not per animal.
- ◆ There is a \$6 AOBA recording fee for every animal entered in the show. This fee is included in the entry fee.
- ◆ Any question about color and fiber length will be resolved at the time of check-in. **Please check your animal's color with the ARI color chart and the 2010 AOBA Show Division Handbook color definitions before filling out the class entry form.**
- ◆ **Bred and Owned Yearling class is a single entry of a full fleece yearling alpaca. An exhibitor may enter one alpaca per breed type/gender.** The alpaca shown must be owned by the exhibitor and must be from a dam that was owned by the exhibitor at the time the dam was bred as evidenced on the ARI Registration Certificate for the yearling.
